Determining your study style



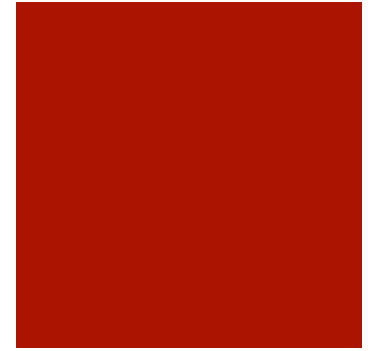
- What type of setting motivates you to study?

- Keep your safety in mind when studying late

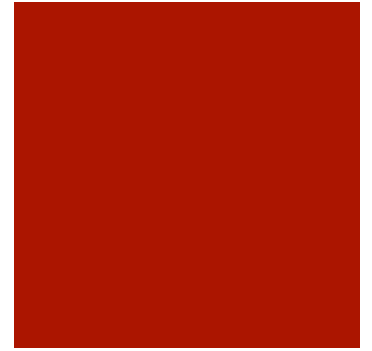


Quiet Places
